

IPv6 Adoption & Assimilation in Organisations



Purpose of the study

- To understand why some organisations adopt IPv6, and others do not

Benefits of this study

- The aim is to help policy-makers, vendors and managers understand the barriers organisations face in adopting IPv6, and the factors that enable them to overcome these barriers.
- The study's results will help: a) managers when they are making their IPv6 adoption decisions, and b) policy-makers in developing policies to encourage the adoption of this and other innovations.
